Overview:

The Community Food Systems Coordinator leads the Food Action Network of Northwestern Ontario's (FAN-NWO) work on food justice, access, and equity. As a core member of FAN-NWO's team, the Community Food Systems Coordinator will work closely with the Executive Director to grow the organization's capacity, guide long-term planning, and support collaborative food systems initiatives across our region.

Who We Are:

FAN-NWO (formerly the Thunder Bay + Area Food Strategy) is a nonprofit rooted in food sovereignty, equity, and systems change. We work collaboratively with over 40 organizational partners to strengthen community-led food systems through policy, education, advocacy, and network-building. - Support shared initiatives, relationship-building, and cross-sector collaboration
- Contribute to organizational development alongside the Executive Director, including strategy, planning, governance, fundraising, evaluation, and grant writing
- Co-develop the regional food strategy,
- Support and strengthen grassroots food justice efforts led by equity-deserving communities
- Amplify and advocate for dignity- and equity-based food access models
- Maintain up-to-date network contact lists and relationships for various coalitions, tables, and interest groups relating to community food systems
- Develop and share public education, outreach materials, and events
- Administrative and other tasks as needed



Qualifications:

- Commitment to equity, food sovereignty, and community-led solutions
- Work experience in food systems, public health, social work, community organizing, and/or a related field
- Strong written and spoken English skills are necessary
- Strong relationship-building, communication, and facilitation skills; ability to navigate tensions respectfully
- Strategic thinking and experience with project coordination, organizational development, or systems-level work
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively
- Comfort working collaboratively across diverse sectors and communities
- Knowledge of food access frameworks, Indigenous food sovereignty, and antioppressive practice is an asset
- Existing relationships or familiarity with Thunder Bay's food access landscapes is an asset
- Ability to travel within Northwestern Ontario (a valid drivers license and access to a vehicle is preferred)
